PART 1: ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/DECISION IN CLOSED SENATE

1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

The Chancellor as Chair welcomed all members and particularly new members Ms Linda Kenyon and Adjunct Professor Dr Brett Davies.

The Chancellor outlined the changes to the agenda informed by the Independent Review of the Senate and Academic Governance and the work of the Senate Effective Governance Working Group noting the iterative process to improve the agenda and meetings throughout the remainder of 2021.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

The declarations of members were noted.

Dr Sue Gordon, AM advised she is no longer a board member of the Graham (Polly) Farmer Foundation or the Chair of Aboriginal Hostels Limited.

Ms Sue Murphy advised she is now a Director of MMA Offshore Ltd.

9. CHANCELLOR'S UPDATE: INDEPENDENT REVIEW OF THE SENATE AND ACADEMIC GOVERNANCE

The Chancellor outlined his presentations to the Strategic Resources Committee and the Audit and Risk Committee noting the ongoing work to address the recommendations arising from the Independent Review of the Senate and Academic Governance and those of the Senate Effective Governance Working Group.

10. SAFETY AND HEALTH, INJURY MANAGEMENT AND WELLBEING

10.1. SAFETY AND HEALTH, INJURY MANAGEMENT AND WELLBEING REPORT Q1 2021, SAFETY AND HEALTH INJURY MANAGEMENT AND WELLBEING 2020 ANNUAL REPORT AND OTHER MATTERS

The Director, Human Resources, Mr Nigel Waugh joined the meeting.

The Senate acknowledged the significant amount of work undertaken by management to improve the quality of the reports.

The Senior Deputy Vice-Chancellor noted feedback from the Audit and Risk Committee would drive further changes including a focus on safety culture across the University and improvements to the availability and quality of data to inform reporting.

10.2. SAFETY AND HEALTH POLICY, SAFETY AND HEALTH, INJURY MANAGEMENT AND WELLBEING STRATEGY

Introducing the item, the Senior Deputy Vice-Chancellor noted the Policy appropriately reflected the roles and responsibility in relation to safety and health across the institution.

It was noted the Audit and Risk Committee had requested an amendment to the Policy to ensure all classes of employees, contractors etc. are appropriately defined within the document.

Before putting the resolution, the Chair sought Senate's comfort with the proposal that the requested amendments would be managed by the Vice-Chancellor.

RESOLVED - S R28/21

The Senate:

- (a) Subject to minor amendments to be managed by the Vice-Chancellor, approves the Safety and Health Policy (Attachment A); and
- (b) Notes the Safety and Health, Injury Management and Wellbeing Strategy documents (Attachments B E)

Mr Waugh left the meeting.

11. INSTITUTIONAL KPIs - UPDATED

The Senior Deputy Vice-Chancellor outlined the development of the new Key Performance Indicators and feedback received from the Strategic Resources Committee.

In response to queries, the Vice-Chancellor reiterated Executive's commitment to report annually on a range of comprehensive people and culture-related indicators and would consider the 'net promoter score' as one such indicator.

Additionally, the Vice-Chancellor undertook to consider the development of meaningful digital/IT indicators.

It was recommended that management adjust the 2025 target for HDR Completions to 50 per cent to align with the figure stated in the Vice-Chancellor's KPIs at Item 12 and in light of the current HDR student pipeline.

RESOLVED - S R29/21

The Senate approves the updated 2021 Institutional performance indicators and targets as at Attachment A.

12. VICE-CHANCELLOR'S KPIs

The Senate approves the Vice-Chancellor's Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) as at Attachment A.

13. FINANCE REPORT - MARCH 2021

The Chief Financial Officer highlighted the refreshed report format and outlined consultation undertaken with the Strategic Resources Committee and the Audit and Risk Committee to address the discrete requirements of each as outlined in their constitutions.

It was noted the report will continue to evolve to address Senate's requirements, those of its Standing Committees and internal stakeholders.

In summary, to 31 March 2021 the University:

- Has made considerable headway in its efforts to achieve financial sustainability and reductions in its cost-base of \$70m;
- A disciplined approach to continuous improvement is still required if genuine sustainability is to be achieved.

The report was noted.

14. INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO – ANNUAL HEALTH CHECK AND POLICY REVIEW

The Chief Financial Officer advised the recommendations had arisen from Mercer's major biannual review of UWA's investment portfolio and Investment Policy Statement noting the changes reflect a tilt in the Strategic Asset Allocation ranges of the Long Term Pool to greater growth and risk objectives were adjusted in light of the inherent risk within the market.

In relation to the Strategic Asset Allocations, each pool has been considered holistically with changes recommended intended to address the University's return and risk objectives. The Investment Policy Statement has also been updated to incorporate a capped portfolio strategic asset allocation to growth assets of 70%

RESOLVED - S R31/21

The Senate:

- (a) Approves the annual health check recommendations as at Attachment A;
- (b) Approves the changes to the Investment Policy Statement as at Attachment B; and
- (c) Approves the revised Investment Policy Statement as marked up on Attachment C.

15. TEQSA BRIEFING: HESF DOMAIN 3 TEACHING; AND DOMAIN 4 RESEARCH AND RESEARCH TRAINING

The Pro Vice-Chancellor, Academic, Professor Graham Brown joined the meeting and provided an overview of Domains 3 and 4 of the Higher Education Standards Framework and the University's status against these Domains in relation to core activities of the University.

In relation to Domain 3: Teaching, Professor Brown highlighted work was underway to:

- develop a central register of exceptions in relation to the "one higher level" rule for teaching staff;
- develop an explicit statement of scholarship requirements for academic staff; and
- improve teaching facilities and IT systems.

In relation to Domain 4: Research and Research Training, Professor Brown advised issues identified included:

- the need for more systematic and documented research training; and
- the suspension and review of the non-award research (HDR) preparation course.

The briefing was noted.

16. UNIVERSITY POLICY FRAMEWORK

The Senior Deputy Vice-Chancellor noted the revised Policy had been through an extensive consultation process.

In response to a query on the breadth of its application, it was confirmed that the Policy applied to the Senate as members of the University Community as defined in the *UWA Statute*.

The General Counsel was requested to confirm that the definition of Policy includes codes of behaviour e.g. the *Code of Conduct*, the *Code for the Protection of Freedom of Speech and Academic Freedom*.

It was noted solutions are being sought to address the accessibility of policies on the University website.

RESOLVED S R32/21

The Senate approves for immediate implementation:

- (a) the Policy Framework Policy at Attachment A; and
- (b) the Terms of Reference for the Establishment of the Policy Management Control Group at Attachment B.

The Student Guild President detailed the review undertaken by the Guild to ensure alignment of policies, regulations, rules and stances with the Code. She noted the Standing Orders are currently under review.

The report was noted.

19. SENATE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Chancellor noted the course developed by the University Chancellor's Council in consultation with the AICD was that preferred by the Chancellor's Committee.
